



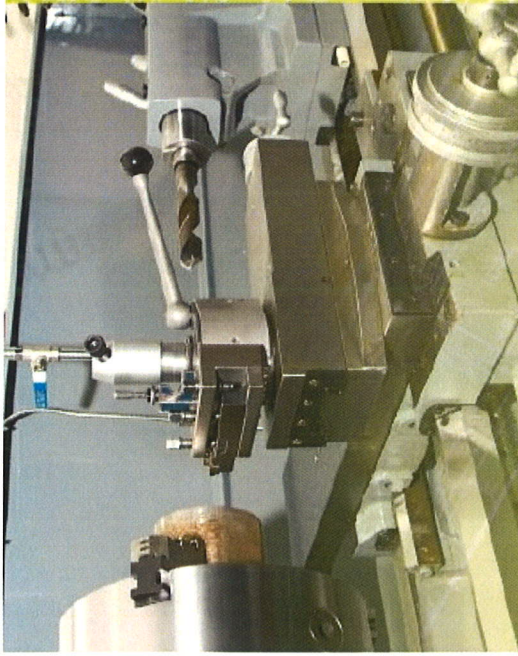

ATIM is collaboration across counties to work with employers in developing workers for high demand manufacturing jobs.

The ATIM Program is designed to provide manufacturers with access to qualified job candidates for high demand occupations.

As manufacturers increase production, expand operations, and replace an aging workforce, they are faced with the challenge of finding workers with the right skills. There is currently a mismatch between the skills job seekers have and the skills required for today's manufacturing. The ATIM Program is designed to address this skills gap.

Since the program is aimed at addressing the specific needs of local manufacturers, its success will depend on manufacturers getting directly involved!

How can manufacturers be part of the ATIM Program?

Advisory role - Provide advice and direction on criteria for selecting individuals most appropriate for employment in the manufacturing industry.

Problem solver - Share information about current hiring practices and challenges. Share information about skill and aptitude test that have worked best during the job application phase.

Referral source - Refer job applicants lacking the necessary occupational skills and certifications to the ATIM Program for training.

Training expert - Identify skills and certification requirements for short-term and long-term hiring projections.

Work-based learning site - Provide work-based experience/internship opportunities to ATIM participants (ATIM Program reimburses wages).

New employer - Provide ATIM participants hiring consideration for job vacancies.

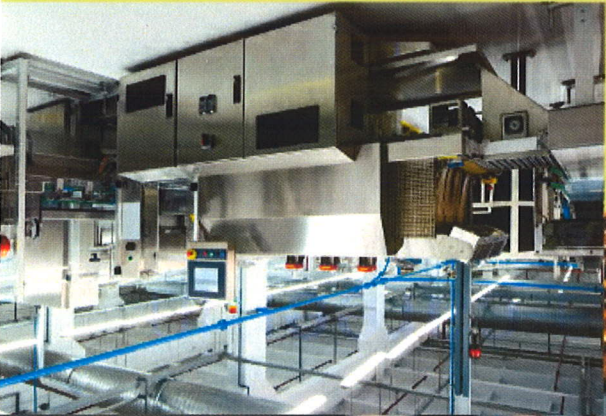


The Metro Suburban Accelerated Training for Illinois Manufacturing (ATIM) Program is funded by the Illinois Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity (DCEO) as part of a Workforce Innovation Funds grant awarded by the U.S. Department of Labor. The goal of the ATIM Program is to provide training that prepares individuals for employment in jobs currently available in the manufacturing industry. As required by the federal government, the DCEO is conducting a study requiring eligible persons enrolled in the ATIM Program be selected through a lottery system. Those not selected through the lottery will not be able to participate in any ATIM Program.

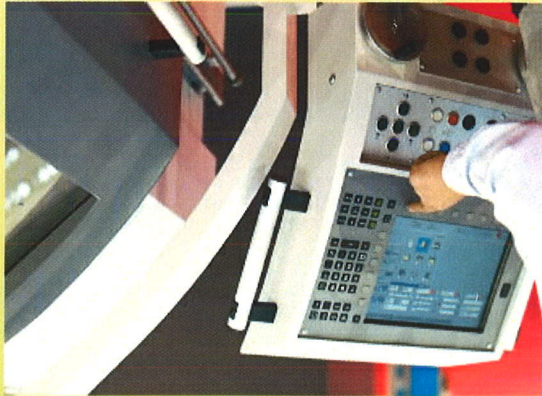


The Accelerated Training for Illinois Manufacturing (ATIM) Program provides short-term training for jobs currently available with area manufacturers:

(ATIM) Program

The ATIM Program is designed to provide manufacturers with immediate access to qualified job candidates for high demand occupations.



What is the ATIM Program?

- The Metro Suburban Region has received a \$2 million grant award to work with employers in developing workers for high demand manufacturing jobs. The program will primarily benefit manufacturers in DuPage, Kane, Kendall, Lake, McHenry, and Will counties.
- The program is administered through a partnership that includes Workforce Investment Boards and respective local WIA Programs/IllinoisworkNet Centers, economic development organizations, industry associations, and manufacturers.
- Training will focus on providing individuals with skills and industry credentials needed for the following occupations: CNC Operators, Welders, Mechanical Engineering Technicians, Industrial Machinery Mechanics, Machinists, and Electronic Repairers/Robotics Technicians.
- Trainees must demonstrate attainment of occupational competencies prior to placement in paid work experiences/internships or employment.
- The Metro Suburban ATIM Program will train approximately 170 individuals during the period of August 2013 to March 2015.
- The program's success depends on manufacturers being directly involved in the program!

How can manufacturers be part of the ATIM program?

- Participate in planning and implementation activities – providing guidance on selecting individuals most appropriate for employment in the manufacturing industry.
- Refer job applicants lacking the necessary occupational skills and certifications to the ATIM Program for training.
- Share information about current hiring practices and challenges.
- Identify skills and certification requirements for near-term and long-term hiring projections.
- Provide work-based experience/internship opportunities to ATIM participants (ATIM Program reimburses wages).
- Provide ATIM participants hiring consideration for job vacancies.
