MEET ENTRANCE REQUIREMENTS

- Complete intake application
- Take placement test
- Interview with an Accelerating Opportunity coordinator

ENROLL IN CNC OPERATOR CLASSES

Complete 20 credit hours of computer numerical control (CNC) operator and supplemental adult education support classes to earn the Basic Vocational Specialist certificate in CNC operation. This prepares you to work as a CNC operator, CNC machinist and set-up, machinist/programmer, or tool and die maker apprentice.

TAKE ADDITIONAL CLASSES FOR GREATER CAREER AND SALARY ADVANCEMENT

- Forty credit hours are required to earn a Vocational Specialist in computer integrated manufacturing (CIM) certification, which leads to a career as a CNC programmer, CAD mechanical designer-detailer, MasterCAM toolpath programmer, general machinist, hydraulics technician, or quality control technician.
- For a total of approximately 70 credit hours, earn an Associate of Applied Science degree to work as a production manager, CAD/CAE/ CAM designer or programmer, tool designer, or prototype model maker.
