## TAKE ADDITIONAL CLASSES TO INCREASE YOUR OPPORTUNITIES FOR CAREER AND SALARY ADVANCEMENT

- For a total of 33 credit hours, earn a
   Vocational Specialist in welding to work as
   a boiler maker, pipe/pipeline welder, steel
   erector, plumber's assistant, steel alloy
   metals repair welder, or to weld repairs on
   tool and die/molds.
- At 60 credit hours, an Associate of Applied Science degree in welding fabrication technology is awarded for careers as entrylevel welding project manager, supervisor, or metal fabricator.
